causes the growing storm t	o start to rotate around	l its center (called the	eye). At a certain height, the wate
vapor condenses, changing	to liquid and releasing	g heat. The heat draws	more air and water vapor upward
creating a cycle as air and w	vater vapor rise and liqu	aid water falls. If the cy	cle speeds up until winds reach 118
kilometers per hour, the sto	rm qualifies as a tropic	al cyclone.	
Most deaths in tropical cycl	ones are caused by stor	m surge. This is a rise in	n sea level, sometimes seven meter
or more, caused by the stor	m pushing against the o	ocean's surface. Storm	surge was to blame for the flooding
of New Orleans in 2005. Th	e storm surge of Cyclo	ne Nargis in 2008 in My	vanmar pushed seawater nearly fou
meters deep some 40 kilom	eters inland, resulting i	n many deaths.	
It has never been easy to for	recast a tropical cyclon	e accurately. The goal i	s to know when and where the nex
tropical cyclone will form.	"And we can't really of	do that yet," says David	l Nolan, a weather researcher from
the University of Miami. Th	ne direction and strength	n of tropical cyclones ar	e also difficult to predict, even with
computer assistance. In fac	t, long-term forecasts	are poor; small differen	nces in the combination of weather
factors lead to very differen	it storms. More accurat	e forecasting could help	people decide to <u>evacuate</u> when
storm is on the way.
