## A Safer Future with Renewable Energy

Renewable energy sources like biomass, wind, solar and hydroelectric energy can meet the world's energy demand as they provide energy services based on locally available resources. In other words, renewable energy sources are (21) $\qquad$ and all around us. Sunlight and wind, for example, are such sources that are constantly being replenished. According to research by the United Nations, these green energy sources currently supply (22) $\qquad$ - 15 to $20 \%$ of the world's total energy demand.
