Water pollution can be caused by a variety of sources, and it continues to be one of the most pressing environmental issues around the world.

Firstly, untreated sewage is often dumped directly into rivers, lakes, and oceans. This is not just a problem in developing countries; even some developed nations struggle with outdated or overloaded sewage treatment systems. As a result, the release of untreated or poorly treated wastewater leads to a decrease in water quality and poses **significant** threats to human health, including the spread of diseases such as cholera and dysentery. Secondly, cruise ships are another major contributor to ocean pollution. These ships generate enormous amounts of waste, and unfortunately, many of them still rely on waste treatment technologies that are more than 30 years old. It is estimated that 40 percent of cruise ships use outdated systems, which release sewage containing harmful bacteria, toxic heavy metals, and various **pollutants** into the sea. These contaminants are hazardous not only to marine life but also to the people who depend on the ocean for food and livelihoods.

Thirdly, oil spills are a serious cause of water pollution. While some spills occur accidentally during refueling operations, others are the result of pipeline ruptures or tanker accidents. Even small spills can be damaging, especially in environmentally sensitive areas. Large oil spills, however, are catastrophic events with long-term impacts. They can destroy marine ecosystems, kill wildlife, and severely damage local economies dependent on tourism and fishing. Addressing water pollution requires urgent and coordinated global action.
